



In June 2019, NAC received a call from Juan Vazquez asking how to activate the Rancho West Neighborhood Association, located south of Rialto Ave and west of Rancho. He and his neighbors had reached a point of intolerance of the issues they had been facing for too long—code violations, traffic and parking infractions, unacceptable behavior by transients and patrons of the liquor store, shootings, and more. NAC responded by meeting with Juan to discuss the benefits of organizing a Neighborhood Association. Twelve concerned folks showed up. They were so anxious to get started, that very night, they selected a president and a board and scheduled their first official neighborhood meeting. We put them in touch with their Western District SBPD District Commander and their Ward 3 Councilmember — and they've never looked back!

Since then, they have addressed many issues: removal of non-op cars from the streets, speed limit and no parking signs installed, tree trimming, code violations enforced, training of neighbors about reporting illegal dumping and graffiti, increased law enforcement involvement and regular PD patrols.

Two members of the RWNA are graduates of the 2019 NAC Leadership Academy Program and they're looking forward to implementing their mini-grant toward improved security lighting, graffiti removal, and freshy painting garage doors.

The Rancho West NA has a bright future of Neighborhood Development and Building Relationships. They are Making a Difference one step at a time!
